CHAIRMAN'S REPORT - Colin Harris

The AGM was held on the evening of 27th March at St John's Church Hall well attended. and was very Nick Hurd Ruislip/Northwood MP made a flying visit on his way to the House of Commons and spoke about his campaign for the retention of the Cancer Centre at Mount Vernon, which is beginning to gather momentum now that Hatfield has been ruled out as a likely site. Numerous questions were asked and answered before time forced his departure.

Local policeman Sergeant Ratcliffe was unable to attend due to health problems. However, in his absence and on his behalf Alan Prue put forward the proposal that the NRA part fund a speed gun at a cost of £2,000. After some discussion this

motion was almost unanimously overruled.

The nominated members of the Executive Committee were duly elected and they are: Tony Goom (President), Leonard Hall (Vice President), Colin Harris (Chairman), Ros Plume (Treasurer), Ann Bailey, Lisa Maclay, Valerie Mellor, Lesley Davis, Sue Boultbee, Miles Gillman, Keith Baker, Alan Prue, Andy Cockeram, Chris Duffy and Barry Crowe.

Ward Councillors, Ian Oakley and Scott Seaman-Digby joined NRA members Alan Prue, Valerie Mellor and Keith Baker on the panel to provide answers to the questions previously submitted by members.

HEALTH - Valerie Mellor, Lesley Davis

We await the outcome of the Hillingdon Primary Care Trust's deliberations on the Northwood and Pinner Community Hospital, following a well-attended meeting on 18 April at the Winston Churchill Hall.



We await a decision, due any day, on Harefield Hospital's application for Foundation Trust status.

Hillingdon Rebuild

The style of hospital treatment is changing. There are fewer patients in hospital as refined drug treatment and minimally invasive procedures, such as keyhole surgery, enable earlier discharge. Wherever possible, patients are treated in the community. This leads us on to news about Hillingdon Hospital's proposed rebuild: it is planned to replace wards with 100% single rooms. This will aid infection control and patient safety. The arrangement will offer greater comfort for patients, who will have their own en suite WC and shower, as is usual in private hospitals. Let's hope that the intensive work that is being done to create a superb hospital will also ensure adequate parking for patients and visitors.

We are informed that the Hillingdon Urgent Care Centre is now up and running. This means that patients attending A & E with a primary care problem, rather than an accident or emergency, can be treated there by a primary care physician.

Also up and running is the Referral Management Centre, offering a clinical assessment and treatment service ('CATS'), starting with Dermatology, but later covering musculo-skeletal services, cardiology, ophthalmology and COPD.

These two services are run by Hillingdon Health Ltd., a joint venture company of Hillingdon GPs and Harmoni.

Hillingdon PCT

Hillingdon PCT Chief Executive, Antony Sumara, has left this post after six months to become Turnaround Director of NHS London, our new Strategic Health Authority. He has left the PCT in better financial shape, reducing the current year's deficit from £22.5 million to £11 million. It is expected that next year, the Hillingdon PCT will achieve in-year balance. However, £54 million of historic debt will be carried forward.

Prescription Charges

From 1 April, prescription charges have risen by 20 pence to £6.85. There is also an increase in NHS dental fees: Band 1 treatments will cost £15.90, Band 2 - £43.60 and Band 3 - £194.




Eastbury Road Improvement






Refuse Collections

The contractor has now done most of the additional work required due to last summer's dry weather and steps are in hand to arrange for the use of the field by organisations as soon as possible.



The plan is to make the field available for hire by organisations in Northwood and local community who wish to use This will include Holy Trinity School, who until now have not had a green play area. Holy Trinity Church organisations, Northwood Cricket Club and other local organisations.

The field was purchased with a gift from an anonymous donor by National Playing Fields Association and developed thanks to a lottery grant from the New Opportunities Fund. We will advise details of letting arrangements in a subsequent newsletter.

PLANNING - Alan Prue



Since February the Association has considered some twenty-six planning applications objecting to six of these, notably 11 Clive Parade, 34-38 Chester Road, Land to the rear of 128 Hallowell Road, Land to the rear of Aviemore and Fallowfield (High Elms Close), 80 High Street and Land to the rear of 16 Watford Road. We must continue to be vigilant particularly in the

cases of Land to the rear of Aviemore and Fallowfield where the developer continues to submit applications which are totally inappropriate and 34-38 Chester Road.

POLICE - Ann Bailey

With our Safer Neighbourhood Team in place - have you met James and Michele our new PCSOs?, both the Team and the Panel need to know the concerns of Northwood Communities about problems which can be alleviated with targeted policing.

Without feedback from the community it is difficult to know your concerns and solutions! I would like Northwood residents to feed back information about identifiable trouble spots and problems. Attendance at the Public Meeting arranged to launch Safer Neighbourhood was minimal and the only problem highlighted was poor driving and particularly speeding. Although the reason for refusing to contribute a small sum from the Residents' Association towards the purchase of a traffic speed gun for use exclusively in Northwood was understood, our team believe wholeheartedly that use of a speed gun would be the most effective way of deterring speeding and making our roads safer, not only for other drivers but also for pedestrians. We will continue to pursue ways of fighting the speeding menace on our highways.

The Hillingdon Police Consultative Committee is very concerned about serious anti-social behaviour on buses throughout the Borough and measures are being taken to try to ensure that people using public transport do not feel under threat.

The good news is that crime in Northwood is generally down but please take your Sat. Nav. with you and do not leave it in the car and remember that mobile phones and cars should be kept apart. The number of people continuing to be seen using their phones when driving is causing great public disgust, it is dangerous to you and our road users and it is illegal!!



LOST AND FOUND

Imagine you are walking along Green Lane and you spot a bunch of keys in the gutter. Of course you pick them up, but realise there's no means of identifying the owner. So what do you do next?

Answer: take them to your friendly, local Police Station.

Similarly, suppose you have lost your wallet while out shopping. After retracing your steps and asking shopkeepers if they have found it, your next call should be to the Police Station.

You would be amazed at how much property is handed in at the Police Station, from jewellery to passports and even wallets with their contents intact.

It's always worth reporting lost property. Northwood Police Station front counter is manned by volunteers who carry out many varied duties, but one of the most rewarding aspects of the job is reuniting members of the public with their lost property.

Northwood Police Station is open to the public from 11am to 1pm every Monday to Friday apart from Bank Holidays.



MOON OVER WATFORD

Is this the name of a new pub or dubious behaviour in the Harlequin Centre? No, it's the latest offering from Northwood author, Lynn Phillips.

The Moon in question is Superintendent Moon, in charge of Watford Police Station where the protagonist, Greta Pusey, is based. Since our encounter with Greta in the award-winning Watford Under Wood, she has been promoted to DS and has passed her induction with SOCO. How will she cope with her first big murder case?

Lynn Phillips' second crime novel is written in her distinctive fast-moving style with a full cast of diverse yet credible characters. The plot swings from a dismembered body to emerald smuggling via drugs and the CIA and takes in familiar locations such as Croxley Green and the canal at Rickmansworth.

Lynn succeeds in cleverly weaving Greta's and her colleagues' personal lives in with their working lives. These sound like 'real' police officers – i.e. human. But does Greta get her man? I recommend you read this gripping novel to find out.

MANCHES MOOR PARK 10K & JUNIOR FUN RUNS 2007



The sixth annual 10k race will take place on Sunday 30th September at Merchant Taylors' School. This popular traffic-free event has attracted a growing number of runners each year with more than 700 people taking part last year. The junior races have also been well supported.

This event raises money for the Lynda Jackson Macmillan Centre (LJMC), the support and information service at the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre. The centre's services include a drop-in centre, telephone helpline, counselling and complementary therapies. The LJMC receives 15,000 requests for help each year but is only partially funded by the NHS.
