# **Before and After!**

Sometimes we notice unusual things as we walk or drive around Northwood, sometimes even the unusual merges into the background or into a part of our sub-conscious, but when it comes to dumped debris or waste materials, these tend to immediately stick in the mind.

Rubbish deposited on our town pavements and verges is often reported by residents, not just by committee members of the NRA. These reports of dumped material often arrive soon after the rubbish has been deposited; we may even be informed of the alleged culprits. If we are provided with pictures, then we can report matters to the council and get a clean-up team out to address the issue quite quickly.

One recent example was in the wide alley just beside the Cancer Research Charity shop in Northwood's Green Lane where dumped material became a regular occurrence. It was frequently reported to the NRA. Then the alleged dumpers were identified and reported to us by a well meaning individual and the appropriate Hillingdon Councillor was invited by the NRA to intervene. We understand that appropriate action was taken, which in this instance was strong advice with a warning that continuance of dumping would incur a fine.

It is unnecessary to dump household goods that are no longer required, even large items, when there are perfectly good council-operated collection services and special collection services available to Hillingdon residents.

Please help to keep our town and residential areas clean and free from litter.

# From the Chairman

#### INTRODUCTION

Reading, listening to and watching the daily news makes life somewhat depressing these days. Before writing this article, I read through the draft of this newsletter and immediately my spirits were lifted. Pictures of Jubilee celebrations, residents' involvement in a multitude of societies and events, adverts for a variety of businesses - all show what a vibrant place Northwood is and how lucky we are to live here and I feel very privileged to be part of it.

#### **QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE CELEBRATION**

A brief note of thanks to all of you who made this momentous occasion such a great success. It was mentioned to me that we should hold events involving the local community more frequently. *Jubilee in the Park* took a year to organise and the three events held in recent years were organised by the same team, most of whom are no longer able to make the same commitment. We have written an instruction manual so will anyone volunteer for the next occasion?

#### **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

The AGM held in June was a success although attendance was on the low side (60 plus speakers, councillors and committee). History shows that attendance is only high when there is a subject of particular concern on the agenda (such as the station development). Very few attendees took advantage of the coffee and tea served in the Oasis Lounge and we are debating as to whether we should continue with it.

Our speaker, ClIr Ian Edwards the new Leader of Hillingdon Council, gave us a very interesting and comprehensive briefing of the Council's facilities, finance and services and answered a multitude of residents' questions. It was encouraging to hear the point that a review of the size of the Council's management is being carried out and any savings made used to maintain the employment of front-line staff. Mr Edwards complimented the NRA on its contribution and has asked to return next year.

# **LOCAL POLICE**

Once again the local police stated they were unable to attend the AGM. There is a lack of involvement from the local management and emails often go unanswered. No response has been made to the request for an article in this newsletter. However, I must mention that John Usher, our long-term local PCSO, continues to carry out his duties diligently and willingly in spite of lack of support from his superiors.

Cllr lan Edwards stated he was very unhappy with police performance in his AGM address. MP David Simmonds made similar comments at the last AGM.

Hopefully the change of Met Commissioner will bring about some improvement.

#### **PARKING**

The new parking meters are definitely not user friendly. Frequently buttons either stick or do not register and operation is very slow. Surely the Council didn't need to change the meters solely in order to increase charges. Comment on the adverse effect of the increase in charges on our Hertfordshire residents and our



businesses is made in the Traffic report on page 4. I also pointed out to Ian Edwards at the AGM that the high charges to non-Hillingdon Northwood residents was inequitable and damaging to business but the comments fell on deaf ears.

#### **OUR HOSPITALS**

The report on page 8 details the progress on the new hospital development at Hillingdon. A planning application has been lodged with the Council with the hearing due in September. One hopes that the funding doesn't get lost in the current government trials and tribulations.

At Mount Vernon, the use of facilities by Hillingdon Hospitals continues to increase and will continue for many years to come. At the Cancer Centre, work is continuing to develop the business case for the re-provision of the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre whilst the team awaits a decision from the New Hospitals Programme on funding for a new Mount Vernon Cancer Centre at Watford. In the meantime, support continues to be provided to the existing site to ensure it can deliver cancer services to patients in the short to medium term. £7.5million has been allocated to refurbish the old buildings.

#### **SUMMER NOISE**

Like many residents, I like to sit in my garden during the warm days and evenings. However, my enjoyment is very often spoilt by noise created by inconsiderate neighbours. Do they have to use garden machinery in the evening and on Sundays, why do they have to play music at such high volume? Surely the offenders cannot be NRA members?

Thanks to all Area Road Stewards and Road Stewards for your magnificent work delivering newsletters, collecting subs and feeding information back to the committee. # **Traffic and Highways**

# NORTHWOOD TRAFFIC STUDY Rickmansworth Road/Green Lane/Maxwell Road

History:

The original site visit took place on 13th March 2017 with Bob Castelijn, LBH (since retired), Tony Ellis and Peter Lansdown. This was to identify the scope of the project. The draft report, officially named the Northwood Area, Traffic Study, Technical Note, dated July 2018, was received by Northwood Residents' Association at the end of November 2018.

Since then there has been an exchange of emails with Cabinet members Cllr. Keith Burrows and Cllr. John Riley, with no progress. Now the responsible Cabinet member is Cllr. Jonathan Bianco.

I understand that Transport for London (TfL) is responsible for all work in connection with traffic lights and associated equipment. It seems that LBH depend on TfL for funding of all other work on the borough's roads with the possible exception of minor safety projects. At present TfL is short of financial resources. Hence no progress for the foreseeable future.

# **PETITIONS - Rickmansworth Rd/Green Lane Junction**

There are two active petitions for some form of pedestrian crossing initiative at this junction.

The first was raised over two years ago for a "PEDESTRIAN PELICAN CROSSING AT RICKMANSWORTH ROAD AND GREEN LANE". On I I<sup>th</sup> March 2020, Cllr. Keith Burrows held a meeting to discuss this matter, when he agreed to carry out a traffic survey to check the level of pedestrian traffic. No progress with this so far, although I understand that it may be under consideration at present.

The second is an ePetition raised by local residents on 17/05/22, running until 15/08/22, and states "We the undersigned petition Hillingdon Council to install a safe pedestrian crossing at Rickmansworth/Green Lane". With reference to the paragraph above, this would appear to be unnecessary. (To view the petition, type "epetitions" in the Search box on the LBH website, www.hillingdon.gov.uk and follow the links.)

#### **PARKING METERS**

Parking charges in Hillingdon have recently risen - again - with a significant increase for out of borough people, who are also no longer entitled to the free 30 minutes. (Residents must use their Hillingdon First card). This will be of particular concern to Northwood residents who live in Hertfordshire, but use Northwood for their local shopping. At this difficult time, businesses will be worried about a possible reduction in footfall, which could be disastrous for Northwood.

#### **ULTRA LOW EMISSION ZONE (ULEZ)**

It is probable that the newly extended ULEZ may soon be further extended to cover the whole of the Greater London area. If so, it is planned to bring this in at the end of August, 2023. You may need to pay a charge depending on your vehicle, but this will probably only affect petrol vehicles registered before 2005 and diesel vehicles registered before 2016.

# **Planning Matters**

There have been some I I8 planning applications since the last Newsletter and, out of those, I submitted objections or comments on 38 of them, on planning grounds directed at the adverse impact on the neighbours or others affected. The majority of applications continue to be for extensions to existing properties although applications have also been submitted for a full rebuild, and for small blocks of flats.

Dealing with planning applications is something that is a oneoff for most people, and I'm happy to help guide through the process any neighbours who are concerned about a planning application close by. It remains the case that, once approved, neighbours cannot appeal except on a point of process, which is very limited indeed. Therefore, all applications that might affect you, should be studied and dealt with preferably within the timescale referred to on the LBH planning portal. LBH does notify neighbours of planning applications, but anyone can search for a planning application using the following link:

# A Message From Our MP, David Simmonds

Since my last article, life has now returned to normal post-Covid. It is good to see our local economy recovering and the positive impact working from home continues to have on our high streets. The pandemic has encouraged residents to rediscover their local high streets and I know from speaking with local business owners that they are benefitting from this.

**HIGH STREETS ARE CHANGING.** There has been a significant change in the high street economy. This is not necessarily a negative, but instead more reflective of how our high street culture is developing to meet the needs of those it serves. There are fewer retail outlets and many more independent cafes and restaurants, which I know are seen as positive assets to our high streets and are enjoyed by residents.

**EMPTY SHOPS AND TFL.** I do note, however, that residents in Northwood remain concerned about the number of empty shop units, owing primarily to the development of Northwood Station. Having spoken with TfL, I understand that they are progressing with repairs to several units, will be renewing various tenant leases and undertaking a full condition survey of the Northwood Station commercial and residential properties. I will follow developments in this area closely.

**LOCAL CRIME.** Also at the forefront of residents' minds is crime. While there are low levels of crime in Northwood, I know there are concerns about catalytic converter thefts, particularly those of an increasingly violent nature, and drug dealing. After meeting with the Borough Commander for the West Area in Uxbridge recently, I am told that there are ongoing operations on gangs who are behind many of these crimes, which I hope offers reassurance to constituents.

**PLATINUM JUBILEE.** Lastly, it was wonderful to see communities coming together over the Platinum Jubilee Weekend. While it wasn't possible to get round to every event, and I was sorry to miss the event in Northwood, I was pleased to attend some events across the constituency in celebration of HM Queen Elizabeth II. I hope residents managed to enjoy the festivities over the long weekend.

**MEET YOUR MP.** I will be continuing to hold surgeries at locations across the constituency and any residents wishing to meet with me should contact my office. I look forward to meeting with many more of you as we look forward to the months ahead.

# **Metropolitan Line**

SINCE I last wrote we have had plenty of issues on the Met line.

WHEEL ISSUES. Aside from the many cancellations due to the pandemic we then had a period of six weeks over April/May where the entire fleet of the Met line (S8 trains) needed to be checked because of a fault identified on some of the wheels. Startling really given the fleet was only introduced about a decade ago. Contrast that to the Bakerloo line trains which have been used since 1972! Given there are 58 trains on the line this caused considerable delay. Not exactly what the Government wanted when encouraging everyone (who could) to return to the office. This in itself creates controversy. If people can work from home at times, it is surely a no-brainer, not having to commute (and face delays!) whilst also benefitting the local Northwood shops and economy. I wonder how many hours of productivity are wasted on the commute to work rather than being able to WFH? However, not everyone has this 'luxury' or choice and many professions e.g. nurses and cleaners can do without this type of disruption.

**STRIKES.** And there was more disruption recently when the Underground went on strike in alignment with the national rail network. With the promise of more to come, it's really a headache for all us local commuters; even if you don't include work, the line is needed for appointments, visits and other urgent business. Being in suburbia has its many benefits of course, but it's not easy to jump in a bus or on a 'Boris bike' to get us around the City like those based there! Even now on a regular basis we are getting delays due to 'train cancellations.' It's a curious 'catch all' statement but I am told often due to lack of drivers.

THE STATISTICS SAY IT ALL. Looking at the latest year to date stats (for the month of May), the Met line service operated (actual service vs scheduled service) at 77.1% whereas overall performance across the network was at over 90%. We are being hard done by and they must do better, particularly if we are expected to be lured back to the expensive London coffee shops and bars!

Let's hope the strike issues can be resolved, the wheels are finally working, and we have no more pandemics. A summer of content will be most welcome.

# Local Policing from the NRA Police Liaison Officer

Your local Northwood Police Ward Panel met in June for their quarterly meeting at St John's Church, Hallowell Road.

We have an active panel that works hard to keep an eye on our crime levels, reported regularly by our Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT). The panel consists of resident volunteers who want to help our community by ensuring that Northwood crime levels remain low, our SNT, and our Hillingdon councillors.

A FULL AGENDA. Among the many issues we dealt with at our June meeting were: the traffic chaos around Northwood College on Maxwell Road; the noise and disturbance by inconsiderate youngsters racing on the Old High Street, Hallowell Road, and other roads; and theft from our local businesses. We were glad that NRA intervention, together with that of the police and Councillor Henry Higgins, had seen the rubbish in the alleyway at the bottom of Green Lane cleared. We will be publishing our quarterly minutes on the NRA website. What other issues would you like your ward panel to address?

Last month our secretary and one of our most active supporters, Lynette Bridger, died. We send our heartfelt condolences to her family.

Your ward panel is only as good as the assistance we get from our residents. We note that some of you write about crimes on Nextdoor.co.uk. However, unless these are also reported to our SNT they cannot follow up. So, please ensure you ring 101 to report such crimes and, in an emergency, ring 999.

We are seeing an increase in residents signing up to OWL. The new OWL app for smart phones is an extra bonus. Please do sign up to



www.owl.co.uk. It will tell you what is going on around you. It has been designed for you, so please make good use of it. Please join our fight against crime in Northwood.

# From the Treasurer

#### FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS - 2021

Our 2021 Financial Accounts have been Independently Examined and were approved at the AGM. Many thanks to Chris Rogers for kindly providing his professional services as Honorary Independent Examiner. He has been a stalwart member of the NRA and has been providing his services to us for four decades.

We have once again achieved a surplus of Income over Expenditure, thereby maintaining our excellent record of good governance especially considering the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. It should also be noted that this year, we still achieved a surplus after exceptional cots for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration and the new website and domain changes.

The residential subscriptions have remained steady since 2018. Covid-19 has left us with a new environment; it is still not easy for our Road Stewards and social distancing remains a great concern for both residents and Road Stewards. If you have not paid your subscription, then please do so at the earliest opportunity.

At the AGM, I proposed that the subscriptions remain at a minimum of £2 for residents and £10 for businesses. As stated at the AGM, many members pay £5 or more and this year several residents kindly paid £20. I am often asked why we do not raise the minimum sub to £5. There is no need to mandate this as long as many continue to pay £5 or more. Therefore logically, as the number of residents paying £5 continues to increase, the minimum will effectively become £5 in any case.

#### **OUR RESERVES**

Our reserves remain steady as, on average, as we achieve a small surplus each year. Our cash reserves at  $31^{st}$  December 2021 totalled £34,000.

Whist it is prudent to keep some reserves in case of an urgent need, I'm asking you, the members, for suggestions of ways of spending some reserves on projects that will benefit the community. Our objectives are first and foremost to maintain the amenities of Northwood and encourage interest in the welfare of Northwood for the benefit of the residents.

In purely physical presence, NRA contributions are the town centre clock, the two notice boards and some of the benches, the most recent of which is the circular bench around the tree at the junction of Green Lane and Eastbury Road.

We welcome your suggestions.

We will always endeavour to ensure that Hillingdon Council meets its financial obligations; we will not spend money on items for which the council is responsible.

# **ROAD STEWARDS AND COLLECTION OF SUBSCRIPTIONS**

A very big thank you to all the Road Stewards and to Paul Barker for their sterling and dedicated work throughout 2021 in respect of the collection of the subscriptions. Without their dedication and hard work especially during these difficult times we would not have the revenues to pay for our costs.

We will welcome any residents who wish to become Road Stewards and if you are interested in helping, please contact Paul Barker.

Finally, in this new post-Covid environment, I would kindly request that members pay their subscriptions directly into our bank account if possible. Please try to avoid paying your subscriptions in cash; it is extremely time-consuming to collate, list and thereafter bank the cash. Today, it is very easy to pay your subscription directly into our bank account using your banking app on your mobile phone. This will most certainly help the Road Stewards and make their task easier.

# Plans to redevelop Hillingdon Hospital



Hillingdon Council has now officially received the planning application for a New Hillingdon Hospital.

**NHS Foundation Trust** 

The new state-of-the-art hospital for the residents of Hillingdon, and beyond, will have the same mix of services as currently available at Hillingdon Hospital; be built in the same location (next to the current hospital) and the current hospital will remain open during construction.

Most importantly, the new hospital will mean significant improvements in care

for patients including:

- More floor space A 40 per cent increase in floorspace
- More beds From 484 to 489 beds on the Hillingdon Hospital site
- More Diagnostics More CT scanners: from two in the current hospital to five. More MRI scanners: from two (one of which is a mobile unit) in the current hospital to three
- More single bedrooms From around 28 per cent currently to over 70 per cent
- An improved critical care department Next to our high dependency unit and significantly expanded to meet future demand
- A much larger Emergency Department An entirely new department with significantly larger floorspace incorporating specialist services and diagnostics services together on one floor.

There will also be a new maternity unit with everything on one floor - including a midwife-led unit, a separate inpatient area for children and young people and, with more treatment facilities in outpatients, more people can be seen as day cases rather than needing stays in hospital.

# NHS URGENT CARE SERVICE at Mount Vernon Hospital

There is an Urgent Care Nurse Practitioner Service at Mount Vernon Hospital for minor illnesses and injuries that are urgent, but not life threatening.

The Unit is open from

7:30am to 7:30 pm, 7 Days a Week except Christmas Day. First appointment begins at 8:00am and last appointment at 7:00pm.

You MUST have an appointment (Directive of NHS England) to attend the Unit. You have the option of phoning NHS III or you can call the Unit directly on 01923 844263 to obtain an appointment.

The Nurse Practitioners, who run the Unit, will ask a few questions (Triage) to ascertain whether the patient can be seen at the Unit and will be able to provide an appointment to attend. However, if they feel the injury or illness is such that, it can't be handled by the Unit, they will advise the patient to go to A&E at either Watford General Hospital, Hillingdon Hospital or Northwick Park Hospital, depending on where the patient resides.

A GP seeing a patient, who needs referral to the Unit, can phone the Unit and make an appointment on behalf of the patient.

The Urgent Care Service Unit at Mount Vernon Hospital caters for patients from North West London in general. However, they also have patients from Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire.

# THE PHLEBOTOMY UNIT at Mount Vernon Hospital (Blood Tests Department)

The Unit is open from 7:00am to 4:00pm, Monday to Friday.

**URGENT Blood Tests** ordered by the GP (URGENT Label on the Form and Signed) and Blood Tests ordered by Doctors through the Outpatients Departments of Mount Vernon Hospital are carried out at the Phlebotomy Unit. Patients don't have to make appointments. They can just walk in, at the times mentioned above, and have the Test done. There is NO Booking System in operation at the Unit.

Routine and regular Blood Tests, ordered by the GP, should be carried out at the GP's Surgery. Patients must book appointments with their GP Surgery to get the blood test done and **NOT** at the Phlebotomy Unit at Mount Vernon Hospital.

# **INTEGRATED CARE SYSTEMS (ICS)**


There are currently lots of changes occurring in the local health facilities as a result of the 2022 Health & Care Act. NHS organisations over larger areas are coming together to form Integrated Care Systems. There are 40 Integrated Care Systems across England. The Integrated Care Board (ICB) will manage each ICS. They have new powers and responsibilities. The Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCG) have now been incorporated in the ICS. Services now have to work more closely together including Health, Social Care and local authorities. Staff and the community will need to work differently. The Care Quality Commission monitors the quality of the services that are being provided by various parts of the NHS.

We have also been working hard behind the


scenes to make space to receive these items. So all in all, a lot more shelf space and we still have a way to go to make the warehouse itself as usable as possible.


# News From Eastbury Horticultural Society




# Harrow Choral Society's Fond Farewell and an Exciting New Chapter
