
Cofix café has taken the old HSBC premises and serves a variety of casual food and drinks. The owner Fariboz is most welcoming and we wish him and his team good luck.



BROKEN PAVEMENTS


In his article on Page 10 Andrew Egan discusses the terrible state of some of our pavements in Northwood. Recently my wife tripped over a broken slab in Moor Park Road. I raised the issue with an officer at the council who stated that the pavements had been inspected in Moor Park Road and found not to be a problem. Not satisfied with the response, I asked Cllr Higgins to walk around Moor Park and Kewferry Roads with me which he did. He agreed that the pavements were in a terrible state, took photographs and submitted them to the appropriate officer. The response he got was that there are far worse pavements in Hillingdon, funds were limited and nothing could be done. This is not the response I would expect from the council that professes to put its residents first. Please let me have your views.

BUSINESSES AND NEW PARKING FEES

We've yet to establish whether Northwood businesses are losing income following the recent increase in parking fees. I do have anecdotal evidence that Hertfordshire residents are now shopping in Rickmansworth where the first hour is free and subsequent time much cheaper. I did raise the subject with David Simmonds who promised to raise the subject with the Council Leader.

MEMBERSHIP AND MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Our membership remains more or less constant but where we are missing out is in the large number of new blocks of flats where we don't have Road Stewards. If you live in one of these blocks, or know of someone who does, please be a missionary and spread the NRA gospel.



Following the retirement of the current incumbent we are in need of a Membership Secretary to maintain our database and enter subscriptions received. If any member has spare time to take on this vital role, I'd love to hear from you. Limited IT expertise is needed and we will provide a computer if necessary. Most weeks it will take less than two hours.

OUR HOSPITALS

A note about the progress of a replacement for the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre can be found on Page 11. Remedial work to the old buildings has commenced.

The Hillingdon Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust is under constant pressure. As in all hospitals in England, admissions to A&E are now at winter levels and numbers are in excess of the capacity the hospitals were built for. However, waiting times for planned surgery are slowly decreasing at Hillingdon. Remember if you have a minor injury, you can use the Nurse-led Urgent Care Service at Mount Vernon. Ring 01923 844263 for an appointment. Plans are progressing for the new build.

May I make my usual plea at this time of year when the weather is inclement and the nights drawing in? Please drive safely, speeding does not necessarily get you there sooner, and make sure that your elderly neighbours are safe and well.

Traffic and Highways

Northwood Traffic Study Rickmansworth Road/Green Lane/Maxwell Road

History:-

The original site visit took place on **13th March 2017** with Bob Castelijn, LBH (since retired), Tony Ellis and Peter Lansdown. This was to identify the scope of the project.

The draft report, officially named the Northwood Area, Traffic Study, Technical Note, dated **July 2018**, was received by Northwood Residents Association at the end of **November 2018**.

Since then there has been an exchange of emails with Cabinet members Cllr. Keith Burrows and Cllr. John Riley, with no progress. Now the responsible Cabinet member is Cllr. Jonathan Bianco.

I understand that Transport for London (TfL) is responsible for all work in connection with traffic lights and associated equipment. It seems that LBH depends on TfL for funding of all other work on the borough's roads with the possible exception of minor safety projects. At present TfL is short of financial resources. Hence no progress for the foreseeable future.

STILL NO ACTION.

RICKMANSWORTH ROAD

In addition to the above, serious traffic congestion is happening more often on this road between the Ducks Hill Road junction and Maxwell Road, at times causing major

disruption in the surrounding area. This is usually caused by thoughtless parking, meaning that heavy vehicles, buses, etc. are unable to pass each other. This problem may be solved by more double yellow lines, but an unwanted result of this may be increased traffic speeds on the clearer road, which could mean that the Green Lane junction becomes more dangerous for all users.

What do you think? It would be interesting to have your thoughts/comments.

HS₂

We are fortunate in Northwood not to have been much affected by the development of the HS2 line. Earlier this year several heavy loads involved with the construction of the Tunnel Boring

Machines (TBMs) were transported along Ducks Hill Road, the heavier ones at night, with some street furniture removed (now replaced).

The first TBM, named Sushila, was successfully launched at West Ruislip on Thursday, 6th October 2022. It is now heading east on a 24/7 schedule for the next two years, aiming for Greenford. The second TBM, named Caroline, will begin on a parallel route soon.

Planning Matters

There have been 74 planning applications since the last Newsletter and, out of those, I submitted objections or comments on 21 of them, on planning grounds directed at the adverse impact on the neighbours or others affected. The majority of applications continue to be for extensions to existing properties although applications have also been submitted for a full rebuild, and for small blocks of flats.

Dealing with planning applications that affect them is something that is a one-off for most people, and I'm happy to help guide through the process any neighbours who are concerned about a planning application close by. It remains the case that, once approved, neighbours cannot appeal except on a point of process, which is very limited indeed. Therefore, all applications that might affect you, should be studied and dealt with preferably within the timescale referred to on the London Borough of Hillingdon (LBH) planning portal.

Search for a Planning Application

LBH does notify neighbours of planning applications, but anyone can search for a planning application using the following link:

https://planning.hillingdon.gov.uk/OcellaWeb/planningSearch

Just enter the first part of the address in the 'Location' box, Search, and 'View' the documents.

Where you are adversely affected you can submit an objection on the LBH Planning portal. This is very easy to do by using the search link above, viewing the documents, and then going back to the first page and entering the objection by pressing the 'Enter Comment' box.

A petition gives you the right to speak!

If you want to present your case personally to the Planning Committee then you will need to produce a petition with a minimum of 20 signatures of any residents living within the London Borough of Hillingdon who are 18 or over. That will entitle you to speak at the committee meeting for up to five minutes, and it's live on YouTube.

We'll keep you informed

When a major planning application that affects Northwood is submitted, eg development of Station Approach or the former Police Station, we post the relevant information on the NRA website. In addition, all members who have registered their email address with us will receive an email alert.

A Message From Our MP, David Simmonds

Since our previous newsletter, events in the political world have progressed, with the appointment of a new Prime Minister and Government. Cost-of-living worries continue to drive much of the correspondence I receive, and it is vital that we acknowledge the widespread concern about the challenges that our community, and the wider world face over the coming months.

Residents can be assured that I recognise worries and anxieties about this issue, and so I welcome announcements made by the Chancellor in the Government's Growth Plan; a proposal of ambitious measures designed to release the potential in the British economy, back businesses and, vitally, put more money in peoples' pockets, particularly those in lower income households, through stimulus measures, tax cuts and the energy package.

We are starting to see a reduction in wholesale prices for gas and electricity, and a fall in oil prices, which is a step towards lifting the burden many are carrying as a result of the cost-of-living crisis. Already residents are noticing a reduction in fuel costs at the petrol pumps, which I hope will continue to fall. The fall in wholesale energy costs is reducing the likely cost to taxpayers of supporting households and business with energy prices and will feed through into lower bills in the medium term.

I also appreciate that residents in Northwood, and other areas of the constituency, continue to have concerns about crime, particularly catalytic converter thefts, burglaries and drug dealing. Along with Conservative colleagues representing constituencies across London and Greater London, I recently met with the new Metropolitan Police Commissioner, Sir Mark Rowley. We had a useful discussion about

I'm Rosie, David's Chief of Staff, splitting my time between the constituency and Westminster office. I may have corresponded with some of you previously. David usually refers to his staff as 'the brains behind the outfit' and my particular role involves ensuring everything is running smoothly and efficiently (I will let you be the judge of whether I am achieving that). This broadly includes overall office management, such as overseeing staff contracts, pay, the office budget and reimbursement claims, diary management and organising meetings both in Westminster and with local stakeholders, of which I am the main point of contact, from Resident Association Chairs to school visits. I also lead on arranging local 'roundtables', for example with education leads, hospitality business owners, healthcare providers and local clergy, which

residents' concerns, as well as policing priorities for our constituencies. It is early days for him, but he is keen to build a better policing service in our suburbs where we have seen the erosion of standards in recent years.

While the 'criminal landscape' differs between London constituencies, there was a clear message that areas within the London suburbs such as ours, and the type of crimes that take place here, do require more attention. I have been assured that there is a renewed sense of commitment to tackle all crime in all areas of the capital and the Commissioner's statements since our meeting suggests he is taking these issues seriously.

Lastly, I am continuing to hold surgeries (by appointment) across the constituency. Residents who would like to speak with me should contact my office on 0203 545 2462.

are really important for helping David to gauge local opinion on government policy, particularly over the lockdown period.

I also ensure residents are kept up to date with David's activities by regularly updating both his website and Facebook page, writing articles for various local publications, clipping and subtitling videos of David in the constituency and Westminster which are then shared on social media, as well as coordinating the quarterly newsletter (which you can sign up for on the website if you have not done so already). I am also responsible for David's Christmas Card Competition, now in its third year, where we invite school children across the constituency to create a design that will be printed and used as David's Christmas card.

In terms of my contact with constituents, I manage ad hoc areas of what I refer to as 'topical' casework (things, for example, like the vaccine rollout) and correspond on the more 'topical' issues that are not necessarily related to usual policy (there has been quite a lot of this lately – Brexit, lockdowns and leadership) and organise constituent tours of Parliament. I also work on certain local campaigns, which we split between the team, including the Northwood Development and maintaining access to the Pinn Medical Centre.

I hope that has given a bit of an insight into my day-to-day role!

Northwood Residents' Association and the Northwood Police Ward Panel (NPWP) work hand-in-hand to maintain Northwood's status as a low crime area.

And, with your help, we can be even more successful. Your NPWP is actively recruiting for a new secretary and more residents and businesses to join them. We hold quarterly meetings with the local Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) and at least one councillor. Don't keep your safety concerns to yourself – share them with us!

We aim to represent all communities, businesses, groups and individuals in an equal partnership with your NPWP, Hillingdon Council and the Police. We set and identify local priorities for the ward and aim to uphold equal opportunities and foster good relations amongst all members of the community. You want to be part of this!

IF YOU DON'T REPORT IT, IT WON'T BE SORTED. Some of you report thefts and anti-social behaviour on Nextdoor.com. This is a good way to spread the news enabling us all to be on the alert. However, such crimes should be reported in the usual way first. That is to call 999 for current emergencies and 101 for all others.

Your Neighbourhood Watch is a vital part of your fight against crime. Check out the Hillingdon Neighbourhood Watch (HNW) article by Dave Ludlow in this issue. Do YOU know who your HNW representative is? You have a whole dedicated team of volunteers around to keep you safe. Join us!

METROPOLITAN From Northwood SNT POLICE

There have been a few changes in the Northwood Safer Neighbourhood Team recently. Firstly, as it stands your team consists of PC Max Christmas, PCSO John Usher and the team sergeant is PS Gareth Blackburn, who has joined us recently. Inspector Lipinski remains the SNT inspector for Hillingdon. As you may be aware we have also had several probationary officers with us for periods of around six months. After this time they are rotated into other strands of policing such as the Emergency Response Teams. Currently we have one such officer, PC Craft, who should be with us until early next year.

I'm sure all of you will be able to appreciate the unprecedented time we are currently policing. With the state funeral, alongside abstractions for officers on Neighbourhoods to increase Emergency Response Team numbers, as well as operational commitments to work at protests and other events it has become increasingly challenging to have a constant presence in the area. With this in mind though the team has done its best to ensure they are still contactable and seen within the community. PCSO Usher has continued to staff the community events such as the Drop-in Surgeries at Costa Coffee/Waitrose, and the Crime Prevention Stalls that are primarily held by the War Memorial on Green Lane. As we move towards what we hope is a slightly more settled time we can assure you as residents that we will provide the best level of service we can within the circumstances.

NORTHWOOD'S CURRENT ISSUES. In regard to local issues, we continue to receive complaints of speeding across the ward. PC Christmas is trained to use the laser directed speed cameras, and whenever possible the team can be found conducting their own local operations to educate drivers and prevent or detect offences. We are also aware of several thefts from Boots the Chemist that seem to be linked. These offences have been reported and are being looked at by the reporting officers. There are also two males that regularly steal from the charity shops on Green Lane. Please be vigilant and aware of your surroundings when shopping. Overall the crime figures for key offences such as burglary are lower than this period last year. If you would like to learn more please visit the Metropolitan Police website for up to date crime figures.

Hillingdon Neighbourhood Watch



I begin this report by referring to the sad death of Lynette Bridger as reported in Issue 181, who for many years was Secretary of the Hillingdon Neighbourhood Watch Steering Group. Lynette gave freely of her time to manage our coordinators and to run an efficient office, and her dedication to

the task must not go without note. She will be remembered by us all on the committee.

Boundary Changes Create More Work! As you will be aware, Ward boundary changes have come into effect and we are busy working on the OWL (Online Watch Link) communications system to deal with all of the changes that this brings, with a large number of Watches needing to be flagged under the new Ward name. In terms of Neighbourhood Watch membership numbers under the "old" Ward names, Northwood is ranked 9th of the 22 old Wards, with 760 out of a total of 5,240 potential households being registered on OWL to receive messages from the Police and Neighbourhood Watch.

One thing that readers of this article could help to achieve between now and Christmas is to increase the number of people receiving messages, so that collectively we can help the Police to prevent and detect crime. You can do this by joining Neighbourhood Watch, and you can register at



www.owl.co.uk which is secure and free. When joining you can also indicate to the Police whether you have a CCTV System, so that if a crime occurs near you they can contact you and ask whether you would consider searching your system for evidence.

If you are already registered on OWL then of course you will hopefully know the benefits – so please undertake to sign up at least one new member and help to move your Ward – Northwood – up the scale to be in the top five across Hillingdon!

At all other times regular residential nuisance activity should be reported on-line via the council website www.hillingdon.gov.uk/article/5158/Loud-neighbours where a process of how best to report a problem is clearly shown. You can also report via telephone, 01895 556000 but we suggest reporting the activity on-line will achieve a better result.

Use up your Old Postage Stamps - before 31st January 2023


You may have noticed that new 'regular' stamps have a barcode at the right hand side. By 'regular', Royal Mail means those stamps that have a profile of Her Late Majesty The Queen (shortly to be replaced by that of King Charles) on a plain coloured background.

If you have regular stamps without a barcode, you have until 31st January 2023 to use them, or you can 'Swap them out'. You can download a 'Stamp Swap Out' form from the Royal Mail website, complete the form and send it together with your non-barcoded regular stamps to Freepost SWAP OUT. You will receive barcoded stamps in exchange.

Please note swap out forms are not available at Post Offices.

Non-barcoded Christmas stamps and Special stamps (i.e. pictorial stamps issued to commemorate anniversaries and events) continue to be valid for postage and do not need to be swapped out.

Health Matters

PATIENT CARE EXPECTED TO IMPROVE – Quicker Appointments and Procedures.

The four acute NHS Trusts in North West London have formed a collaborative with a Chairman and Board in Common.

The move will strengthen collaborative decision-making and help the organisations make the most effective use of their collective resources to provide better care, for more people, more fairly. This will prove particularly important as the whole NHS seeks to tackle longer waiting times for planned care and increasing pressure on urgent and emergency services.

All four trusts have recently been able to eliminate waits of more than two years by sharing capacity and offering patients the chance to have surgery sooner at a neighbouring hospital.

The agreement is a milestone in the four trusts' plans to work more closely together in a formal structure known as an acute collaborative

Michael Sobell Hospice and Charity

Bhavini Pandya is an Occupational Therapy and Physiotherapy Assistant at the Michael Sobell Hospice in Northwood. She has worked in the hospice's Rehab Team for almost eight years, supporting local people who are facing advancing illness. She says,

"I love my work. We take a very holistic and individualised approach to care and support. It's all about empowering the patient and keeping them as independent as possible. We work with our patients rather than doing things for them.

"My role is varied but centres around keeping patients safe, maintaining their strength, supporting with pain relief and falls management, and, if things change, providing alternative ways of being mobile. As part of occupational therapy, we look at people's daily activities. If those change due to illness, we look to make things easier for them where they struggle. This extends into the community when they're discharged.

"We also do a lot of psychological work, looking at boundaries and barriers and trying to resolve those. We help build people's confidence back up when they start to struggle doing things that they loved doing previously.

"Physiotherapy and occupational therapy enhance people's lives. I'm very lucky to be able to do it."

Uneven and Dangerous Pavements

Much of Northwood has good pavements with property owners attending to the part of their property that borders pavements and pedestrian rights of way. However, in some streets

pavements have become a hazard. Irrespective of whether a pavement has a tarmac surface or if it is created from concrete slabs, if tree roots disturb the ground below the pavement, or if heavy vehicles go over a pavement, cracking and uneven surfaces can result.

Once a paving slab is disturbed at least one side of that slab may become proud of the rest of the surrounding surface. If repairs to pavements are poorly executed an old and a new surface may have a height difference and therefore become not level. From time-to-time pavements may require re-levelling.

Take a look at this picture



A pedestrian has just tripped over a protruding edge of a paving slab outside Cofix in Green Lane just along from the Post Office.



In the next example a cracked slab has a heavily protruding corner and this is near the entrance to St Johns Court in Murray Road. It represents an accident waiting to happen!

Uneven or damaged paving is hazardous whether you are young or old but it is even more serious for the partially sighted or blind people and to those who have difficulty with their mobility.

Always include your address and where possible your email address and phone number, then remember to ask for a response within seven days. Should your action not gain attention in a reasonable timescale, then by all means contact the NRA to seek our assistance.

Radio Mount Vernon

Throughout the Covid months, Radio Mount Vernon continued to broadcast to the patients in the wards at Mount Vernon Hospital using Myriad, a computer system that uses our chosen music to create relaxation and distraction, along with Sky news on the hour.

During this time, we fitted an aerial so that we now broadcast to all areas of the hospital and to anyone tuning to frequency 95.1 within about a mile of the hospital. We can also be heard on our website www.radiomountvernon.org.uk.

Now that Covid seems to be under control, we are back broadcasting live several times a week. Our presenters play songs from yesteryear, often with a theme or a story or two along the way. All this happens in our on-site studio, and it's here that our ward visitors meet before going to Daniels, Trinity and Wards 10 and 11 on the site. On the wards the

visitors chat to patients a little before noting down their choice of music or a song, to be played a little later. Back in our music library, the requests are found on Myriad, CD's, vinyl or sometimes using Spotify. Presenters then put these together to make a great show for everyone to hear.

Two Minutes Silence


We are all familiar with the two minutes silence observed at Remembrance services in November, but have you ever wondered whose idea it was in the first place? Well, its concept is attributed, in part, to one Edward George Honey, an Australian journalist who served briefly with an English Regiment during WWI before being discharged due to ill health.

Honey published a letter in the London Evening News on 8 May 1919 in which he appealed for a five minute silence to be observed during the celebrations of the first anniversary of the end of WWI. No official action was taken at the time, but

in October 1919, Sir Percy Fitzpatrick's suggestion for a period of silence on Armistice Day was forwarded to the King's private secretary.

Perhaps Sir Percy was prompted by Honey's letter; we don't know. But King George V was moved by the idea and he, together with both Sir Percy and Honey, attended a rehearsal for a five minute silence involving the Grenadier Guards at Buckingham Palace. However, five minutes proved too long and the two minutes silence was decided upon.

Edward Honey died of consumption, aged 36 at Mount Vernon Hospital. His grave is in Northwood Cemetery in Chestnut Avenue.



Mount Vernon Cancer Centre Review

NHS commissioners are continuing to work on proposals to relocate Mount Vernon Cancer Centre to the Watford General Hospital site in order to secure the future of specialised cancer services in the area, as well as maintaining services until a new cancer centre can be built.

Another review of alternative options has taken place in recent months, and members of the programme board and members of the patient reference group have reaffirmed that the relocation to Watford with some enhanced services in local areas, is the best option for current and future cancer patients within the Mount Vernon Cancer Centre population.

There is widespread agreement that major changes are needed, but identifying how the change can be funded is still proving a challenge. Discussions with national finance colleagues have been constructive, and further work is taking place over the next month to identify if, how and when capital finance could be made available.

Once the funding picture becomes clearer, there will be more opportunities for patients, carers and local people to get involved in developing the plans. Background information is available at www.mvccreview.nhs.uk


