Northwood Traffic Survey

I have now received a response 6/2/24 from [Cllr Jonathan Bianco as follows](#):-

As you know from my previous email, I have authorised the Council to make the necessary payment to TfL in order for them to consider the introduction of a pedestrian phase on the lights, which I would remind you are owned by TfL and over which, as a result, the Council has no control.

I understand that we are now in the hands of TfL to make that determination and therefore as soon as we hear anything useful from them, I or one of our officers will let you know.

His previous email 9/10/23 was:-

I apologise for not replying sooner however, I have asked officers to respond to me with comments on the suggestions you have made. Once these are to hand, I will let you know what we can do.

The suggestions I made in an email 19/7/23 to the Leader covered the 10 recommendations made in the Traffic Survey report. There appears to be very little connection between these emails!

Northwood Roads

Under this heading three points have been raised with Cllr. Henry Higgins.

1. Pothole/Drain cover, Rickmansworth Road/Green Lane junction.
This has been repaired – hope it lasts.
2. Green Lane car park, re ULEZ. A quick response has been that ULEZ is operational here. As there appear to be no cameras both Tony and I have queried this again.
3. Dene Road yellow lines - A resident has noted that, since the resurfacing of the east end of Dene Road, some parts of the single yellow lines have not been replaced, specifically one section opposite no. 5 and two sections outside no. 7. I suspect there may have been vehicles parked in these areas when the yellow-line gang did its work.

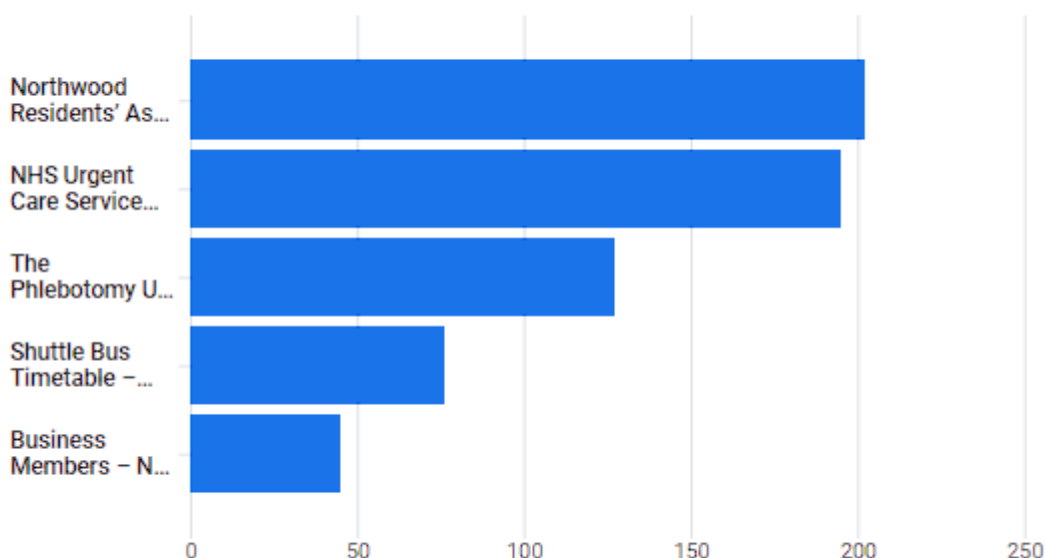

Business Watch:

Together with School Watch these have been our most successful projects. I follow the What'sApp Business Watch discussion. Jennifer is doing an excellent job. The subscribers appear committed to keeping watch and reporting ASB and even minor crimes.

What we expect from our SNT is that they will follow up, make connections and find these criminals. When they don't, both our businesses and residents begin to lose faith. The comments on Next Door bear these out.

I follow up with John Usher on every BW report. As PCSO he is most likely to have local intelligence.

Social Media:

At some point, I suggest we look at social media as another way of increasing communication with our residents. This is a time intensive project and has both benefits and pitfalls. Reasons: Satisfactory highway visibility splays at the reutilised access point are considered deliverable and should be applied. Environment Report

One request to have a pavement levelled in Northwood town centre resulted first with a comment from Hillingdon Council, "Please note however that whilst the Council does have a responsibility under the Highways Act to maintain its footways in a safe condition, this does not mean that it is required to repair every defect of which it is aware. What it means is that the Council must carry out regular inspections and must have in place a clear maintenance policy."

Does the above indicate that if there has been an inspection & there is a maintenance policy in place, the box is ticked? How is a safe condition defined, or is it that just a personal feeling of a Council operative?

Pavements in Northwood have variable surface conditions – ask any regular walker. The standard needs to be set higher and all our pavements should only be in good condition. In a similar vein, the main roads and secondary or side roads around Northwood are in very mixed condition from good to awful. It's the awful ones where standards have to rise and the Council need prompting to undertake remedial work. Where you see potholes do send me pictures and messages to pinpoint their location. Likewise where tarmac surface is breaking up, just take a picture and send it to me together with a comment on the location and I will report it, so remedial teams can find it. In the most recent rains, the corner junction opposite the Gate Pub on the cricket ground side by the traffic lights has flooded again with standing water present hours and hours after rain had ceased. This is after more than one attempt to eradicate the problem by the Council and by Thames Water. Just how many times do we have to suffer standing water issues at this junction. A personal view is that there needs to be a memorable statement given to workers & managers involved in repairs and installation fix situations at both Thames Water and the Council such as, "Get It Right First Time"

Matters reported

Gullies clearance -- tanker vehicle with suction hose down a drain seen working last week. Was this every drain in Northwood or a selective number? My guess is that the latter.

Litter by Vets / Litter in Oaklands Gate to rear of Moka Restaurant - reported to Hillingdon Council.

"Alerts" put out by email (concerning the continued closure of the Oaklands Gate Northwood library due to structural problems with the fabric of the building) caused many concerned responses from members and is being actively pursued by the committee.

From the mojo data base I have created my own spread sheet of Business Members (BM)

As there is time before copy deadline I shall follow up again

One member responded to an email of mine asking for more exposure to the Northwood community through the NRA and suggested a facebook page. I believe we had one previously so is it time to resurrect it?

I also had my meeting with Jennifer of the **Three Wishes** pub which proved most informative. We obviously discussed the fly tipping and through Committee email exchanges you are aware of the situation and no doubt Andrew will update the Committee

As mentioned in my email of 22 Jan, I feel we should be proactive on this issue hence suggesting we get a local lawyer to ascertain who the Landlords are, write to them advising them of their responsibility to attend to the rubbish on this parcel of private land and the penalties for fly tipping

Finally, you may recall we discussed approaching local places of worship to include an article in their regular mailings high lighting the NRA to their members. I produced a proposed wording and passed it on to Tony. I assume that for Easter they will be circulating something to their congregants and my synagogue will include it in our Passover magazine.

So, to encourage footfall to our local restaurants, would you be willing to run a promotion, a discount, of let's say 20%, in the period up to end of February 14. Other offers would be perfectly acceptable. Although I understand the possible impact on your margin, bigger is most definitely better. 10% will not cut it.

If so, we would then, communicate your offer, and information on your restaurant, to all NRA members, and the discount would require presentation of the email we would circulate

Please let me have your thoughts and what offer you could provide. If approved we would circulate it immediately. Or you may have another suggestion which I would love to hear.
