Perhaps David Simmons assistance might be enlisted if there are sufficient Residents who will be affected by this decision.
On a personal basis having restricted sight following a failed Cataract procedure last year I will now have

Appendix: REPORTS

a) Traffic and Highways

Northwood Traffic Study

In 2017 I wrote - "As a result of pressure from the NRA, the Council Cabinet Member for Planning, Transportation and Recycling has given his approval for officers to proceed with a transport study for the following roads:-

- A404 Rickmansworth Road between Maxwell Road and A4180 Duck's Hill Road,
- Maxwell Road and
- B409 Green Lane"

In early 2019 a draft report was submitted to the Cabinet Member for Planning, Transportation and Recycling, for review.

In 2021 I wrote - "So far little positive has come out of this project - virtually dormant."

Now, after no further action, we have been advised to raise a petition. This has been done and it has been received by the Council. It reads as follows:-

Topic - Rickmansworth Road from Mount Vernon Hospital to the High Street, Northwood, needs improvements to reduce speeding, congestion and accidents.

Desired Outcome - We the undersigned request that Hillingdon Council carry out a comprehensive review of this length of Rickmansworth Road, in conjunction with the Northwood Resident's Association, to identify what improvements can be made to make the road safer.

Rickmansworth Road

The residents of True Lovers Court have again complained about thoughtless parking outside their flats (this was first raised two years ago). Mondial Cars, now a business member of the NRA, often parks, **legally**, a small low-loader immediately alongside the apartment building for extended periods of time. Previously written attempts asking for removal have failed. After helpful discussions with Brian, it has been suggested that the residents should try a face-to-face approach.

78 High Street, Northwood

Having car spaces in front of the shop for use by the completely separate flats will set a precedent which would adversely affect the ground floor shop on this site, and, if repeated because of the precedent then set, other shops in the High Street, Green Lane, and every other shopping area. However, if consent is to be granted for these car spaces, there should be a condition restricting their use to customers of the shop only, and not to anyone else. Otherwise, cars unrelated to the shop will be adversely affecting the business of the shop by hindering shoppers/customers of the shop, in terms of access to the shop and views of the shop front. It will accelerate the closure of shops.

Clearly, the applicant agrees that car spaces are needed on site, but has not provided them to the rear, where they should be. We would suggest the reason there is no off-street parking to the rear, where the flats are proposed, is because of the cramped site for this amount of development.

In a previous application, the proposed hardstanding for refuse on collection day was to be on the pavement in front of the shop, again showing how cramped the site was known to be.

We also consider that, like the previous applications, the proposed flats and amenity space are cramped and will provide relatively poor residential accommodation.

The outlook for the future occupiers would be poor and the internal layout is poor;

For those flats with their amenity space on the roof, and without a lift, it would mean anyone in a wheelchair or with a disability would be unable to get there.

Any children in the flats where the amenity space is on the roof would only have the roof space as outdoor play space. Allowing them to play outside of the ground floor of the flats would leave children unsupervised and at risk, again as referred to in previous applications.

h) Business Membership

February started off as a fairly quiet month until 2 incidents occurred

The first was Peter receiving an email from The True Lover's Knot apartment block asking our help as their near neighbor, Mondial cars was, **legally**, parking their low loader in front of the blocks railings and residents found it unsightly.

Letters had been sent to Mondial cars but with no effect and I particularly liked the way they finished off their email to Peter "*will the NRA please take some action towards 'Mondial Cars' and report back, please?*"

As Mondial is a business member Peter contacted me to see if we could be of assistance although we both agreed it was not the function of the NRA to get involved in disputes between neighbours. However as the author of the email is known to me we agreed I would call him

I then noticed one of the low loaders was now being parked in Copsewood Way and the other alongside the railings of the golf club's car park so no longer an eyesore.

I therefore phoned the email's author and asked if he had ever spoken to Mondial Cars for an amicable discussion, but apparently not, so I suggested he should now do so and thank Mondial for having moved their vehicles and suggest they continue to park them where they currently are.

He was most appreciative of my suggestion, thanked Peter and myself for our help and the good work of the NRA!!

The next occurrence was more disturbing and is a separate item on our Agenda. Namely the graffiti that occurred over the weekend of 22nd February. Hoda will no doubt write more about it in her report and Andrew possibly in his. But if you were not aware quite a few business/restaurant premises had graffiti sprayed on them.

Andrew in his capacity of Environment and myself, as Business, were involved and we both emailed Cllr Higgins who did respond to Andrew saying there was nothing the Council could do and doubted the police would be interested.

I know there was a Borough Police meeting last Wednesday where the police Superintendent and two other officers were present and perhaps the graffiti incident was discussed, but I have had no feed back

On a totally different topic Ros advised me that she had received an email from the Eastbury Surgery Patient Partnership Group (PPG) asking if we could assist the PPG to advertise its existence and recruit interested members from our local community. PPG's are a voluntary group which work with NHS practice staff to represent patients' views and needs. Every general practice has one.

Ros suggested they write a short piece about the PPG and its need for more volunteers, which we could post as a News Item on our website. And also include it in the Spring Newsletter

This led Ros to ask me whether there was any point trying to enrol GP practices as business members? As I mentioned to Ros, I obviously have my own views but should like to hear those of Committee members before proceeding down this path
